To the Christians of the early Church, Pentecost was the most glorious time of the year! Parents and grandparents told and retold the following story of the first Pentecost.

"Jesus had been crucified;" they would say, "but He came alive again, and spent forty days making miraculous appearances; first one place and another. But everyone who loved Him lived in constant fear that they would never see Him again. Then the last time He was with the disciples, He strictly charged them not to leave Jerusalem until they were baptized with the Holy Spirit. Wanting to be obedient, they stayed at Jerusalem for many days after Jesus had gone away to heaven.

"On the tenth day the Hebrew Feast of Pentecost was being celebrated in Jerusalem. Jews from almost every nation under heaven had arrived for the great day. Many of these people could not speak nor understand the language the people at Jerusalem spoke.

"The disciples were not very interested in the festival. Instead of going to it, they met to pray together. While praying in solid unity, the power of the Holy Spirit filled each heart. They began shouting praises to God.

"Soon the crowd that had gathered for the Pentecost festival heard great shouting among the disciples and came to see what was happening. The disciples were so happy,

they began excitedly telling the people about Jesus. Suddenly the disciples realized they were not speaking their own language, but the language of those listening to them. And remember, children," the parents would continue, "there were people 'out of every nation under heaven,' which spoke many different languages!

"Some of those watching, laughed and said, 'These men are drunk.' Then Peter stood up and began explaining what they were doing, and the strangest thing happened. Everyone's head turned as if they were listening, and Peter heard some saying, 'How strange that we understand his words in our own language.' Yes, all those people of different nationalities understood what Peter was saying."

The children always enjoyed listening to this story of that first Pentecost. It was a great day! One to never be forgotten. It was the birthday of the Church of God. On that day, God's spirit was so powerful that 3,000 people turned from their false religions and accepted Jesus. A prophet once asked, "Shall a nation be born in one day?" Yes, a spiritual nation was born on the day of Pentecost.

These born again people were changed into new creatures in Christ. They were then temples for the Holy Spirit to live in. They were the <u>Church of God</u>, which Jesus purchased with His own blood on the cross.

Heaven must have been bubbling over that day when 3,000 were born into the church. For Jesus once said that there was rejoicing in heaven over <u>one sinner</u> that repented. How much would there be over 3,000? So the day of Pentecost was a big birthday gathering of the Church of God.

What is God's Church?

I Cor. 12:12-16, 18, 20, 21, 24-27.

- 12 For as the body is one, and hath many members, and all the members of that one body, being many, are one body: so also is Christ.
- 13 For by one Spirit are we all baptized into one body, whether we be Jews or Gentiles, whether we be bond or free; and have been all made to drink into one Spirit.

The word church and churches can be found 109 times in the New Testament. What is this "Church" mentioned so many times in the New Testament? Is it a beautiful temple, a Christian cathedral, or a humble house of worship? Is it a group of people who believe the same doctrines? The dictionary says a church could be all of these four things. But which of these four meanings did the disciples use? Were they speaking of the buildings where the people worshipped or of the people?

They were speaking of the people. Here is why we know they were speaking about people. The first New Testaments were not written in English. They were written in the Greek language. The Greek word ekklesia was translated into the English language as "church". This word ekklesia means "congregation" so when the New Testament was translated into English, the word "church" meant congregation.

Now let us read some scriptures and put "congregation" in place of "church": "The congregation which was at Antioch," "The congregation of Asia," "The congregation of Galatia," "The congregation of God." Reading the Bible in this way, we have the proper meaning of these verses.

A congregation is a group of people. A group of saved people make up the spiritual body of Christ, the Church of God. "Now ye are the

body of Christ, and members in particular," says I Corinthians 12:27. In Ephesians 1:22 & 23, we read, God "...gave him to be the head over all things to the church, ...which is his body." Also in II Corinthians 6:16, it says, "Ye are the temple of the living God; as God hath said. I will dwell in them, and walk in them: and I will be their God, and they shall be my people." According to the Bible what then is the Church? It is the spiritual body of Christ. It is not His flesh and bones-that body was nailed to the cross and arose again the third day.

This body of Christ, which is the Church of God, has many members, just as Christ's fleshly body had many parts. Each member needs the other and all members are a part of the whole body. Some members of this body are young, some are very old, some are tall, others short, some are pretty, others are not as pretty. Our looks, our age, or who we are does not cause us to be more or less important in God's Church. We are all one.

The communion bread, which represents the broken body of Christ, is made of wheat grains from many fields. All these grains are broken and ground together to make flour from which this bread is made. Not one grain is whole, nor can one pop out of the bread and say, "I am the most important!" All together the grains make one loaf. So every Christian who is cleaned from sin through faith in Jesus is a part of the body of Christ. That is God's church, which is spoken of so often in the New Testament.

Do you belong to an Art Club, the Scouts, the 4 H club, or some other club? Perhaps you are a member of some Bible Club? It costs money to operate any club or organization, so each person willingly pays a small amount when he joins. This is called *dues*. If a member does not keep paying his dues, he forseits his right to be a member of the club.

A church is a religious organization and it too needs money to operate. There are heating and cooling bills to be paid, bills for lights and water, support for workers, and payment or rent on a building. All these things are necessary.


The usual way many denominations meet their expenses is through tithing. (A tithe is a tenth part, or \$1.00 from every \$10.00.) Some require each member to pay one tenth of the money they earn. This and other restrictions such as being baptized and signing promises, help the leaders of the church decide who will be members of the church.

The Church of God operates quite differently. It has no membership books. God is the head. Christ is the door of the Church of God. Every person automatically becomes a member of the Church of God when he or she is saved. He signs no promises, pays no tithes and is not baptized into the church. No man has power to put another person into the Church of God, nor to take one out of the church.

If Christ asks for half of his earned money, then he will give it to Christ. There is no need for a tithing system or for requiring dues in the Church of God.

"On September 1, 1923, a violent earthquake shook the Tokyo-Yokohama area of Japan. Buildings collapsed and fires broke out throughout Tokyo. About 59,000 residents of the city proper died in this disaster, and most of central Tokyo was destroyed."

After the smoke had died away and the dust of the crumbling building had settled, the Imperial Hotel stood erect. She had ridden out the terrible earthquake. The Imperial Hotel was designed by architect Frank Llyod Wright and was built between 1917 and 1922. It was built on a flexible foundation of concrete pads, each supported in turn by slender pin-like piers sunk down through the topsoil to the sea of mud on which the city of Tokyo is built.²

The unusual foundation of the Imperial Hotel was the secret of it withstanding the earthquake. The unusual foundation of the Church of God is what has kept it standing since the day of Pentecost. The church has ridden through many spiritual earthquakes, and she is standing just as strong and sturdy as she was before they struck her. For she is founded on the apostles and prophets, Jesus Christ being the chief corner stone. A corner stone, in Bible terms, means the main foundation. It does not mean a corner of the building as we would think of it today.

The pin-like piers which reach deep into the earth, remind me of the foundation of the church which reaches down deep into the love of God. The piers of the church are the apostles and prophets. Each of these persons reached deep into God's love. There is not one part of the foundation of the

Church of God that is not firmly planted on the love of God.

The love of God is like a great sea, so wide and so deep that its borders nor its bottom can be found. This love is ready to clean up the most wicked sinner, regardless of what nationality he or she may be. It is also able to keep that person saved and established forever.

Jesus Christ is that main foundation. He is a sturdy foundation, yet full of grace and truth. The Old Testament laws were rigid and hard. They were "thou shalt," and "thou shalt not." The penalty for disobeying many of these laws, was death. If a person was caught in adultery, they were to be stoned. If a son was a drunkard and would not work, he was to be stoned. This system operated by the letter of the law, exactly as it was written. Jesus, the founder of the Church of God, said, "The letter killeth, but the spirit giveth life."

When was this church founded? It was founded on the day of Pentecost. about 1,960 years ago. The prophets began its foundation by prophesying about it. The apostles preached God's Word to complete the foundation and the Holy Spirit gave the church its birth on the day of Pentecost. God has used reformers to re-enlighten people to the truth. Some of these were. Huss. Martin Luther, John Wesley, D.S. Warner and others. These men, however, were not founders of the Church of God. It was founded by the apostles and prophets, Jesus Christ being the corner stone. This foundation reaches deep into the love of God and therefore it has stood almost 2,000 years through every spiritual earthquake that has come.

According to the Encyclopedia of American Religions, 4th Edition, 1993, pages 373-478, there are many religious groups in the United States of America who have named their organization, "Church of God", Some of these churches are highly organized and keep close contact with their members. Some have thousands of congregations scattered in many states. Others have only a handful of congregations. Some have added words to their name to distinguish them from other Church of God groups. Church of God Fire Baptized, Church of God Later Day Saints, Church of God Seventh Day, The Universal Church of God, etc., Many have the proper name for their church, so we see that people do understand that the Bible teaches the church is to be kept in God's name.

This reminds me of two scriptures in the Old Testament. One in Zechariah 14:7 "But...it shall come to pass, that at evening time it shall be light." This scripture is prophesying that men will have spiritual light in the evening time of the world. Spiritual light is understanding of God's Word. The other prophecy found in Isaiah 4:1 reads like this, "And in that day seven women shall take hold of one man, saying, We will eat our own bread, and wear our

own apparel: only let us be called by thy name, to take away our reproach." In the Bible the church is often represented as a woman. We see many churches calling themselves Churches of God, but wearing the kind of clothes they want to wear, and living like the world. However, those in God's church dress modestly, as His word teaches, and live godly.

We must all realize that attending service in a Church of God is no assurance that we are saved, for not all Churches of God are a part of the body of Christ which is the heavenly Church. Salvation comes only through faith in Jesus' blood. This alone will make us a part of the heavenly Church of God which Jesus will take to heaven.


After the meeting in Repalli, Jaya wanted to go to Panamaru.

The First Sermon of the Church of God

32 This Jesus hath God raised up, whereof we all are witnesses.

- 33 Therefore being by the right hand of God exalted, and having received of the Father the promise of the Holy Ghost, he hath shed forth this, which ye now see and hear.
- 34 For David is not ascended into the heavens: but he saith himself, The LORD said unto my Lord, Sit thou on my right hand,
- 35 Until I make thy foes thy footstool.
- 36 Therefore let all the house of Israel know assuredly, that God hath made that same Jesus, whom ye have crucified, both Lord and Christ.

The first message of the Church of God was that Jesus is the Saviour of all the world. That very day while Peter was speaking there were men, women and children of at least fourteen different nationalities listening to him. To all of them he announced, "Whosoever shall call on the name of the Lord shall be saved." This was prophesied by the prophet Joel years ago, and on the day of Pentecost it came to pass. Now through faith in Jesus any person can be saved from sin and enter into the presence of the holy God.

This was an unusual sermon. Everyone listening could understand. The people were surprised and said one to another, "How do we hear this man in our own native language when he is speaking his own language which we do not know?" Also, in those days, only men of education dared to give a public address, and their speeches were written ahead of time and delivered later. This impromptu speech by an uneducated fisherman was heard in many languages.

In this sermon, Peter proved to his listeners that the Jesus they had crucified was truly the Saviour, whom God had sent to the world. "The miracles and wonders He did could only be done by the Son of God," Peter said. The people knew what he said was right, for some had heard about Jesus changing water into wine at the wedding feast in Cana. Others had eaten that day He fed 5,000 men with a few loaves and fishes. Some had returned to their homes walking beside a sick person whom Jesus had healed. Others remembered hearing about Jesus walking on the stormy sea, then calming the storm. Yes, they agreed, the miracles that Jesus performed proved He was the Son of God.

Another proof of divine authority was that He came back to life after being crucified. "Our great King David told us that death could not hold the Saviour whom God would send. And that the body of the Saviour would not decay as all bodies do," Peter told them. "You see, Jesus did rise again and stayed on earth for forty days. Five hundred men and women saw him. Does not this prove that Jesus, whom you crucified, is the Saviour for whom we have been looking? I say that it does, and that ye must all be saved," Peter continued.

Then the crowd cried out, "What shall we do to be saved?"

"Repent and be baptized every one of you in the name of Jesus Christ for the remission of sins," Peter answered, "and ye shall receive the gift of the Holy Ghost."

The people gladly repented and were baptized. The result of the first sermon was that 3,000 people were born into the Church of God that day.





The man's mother demanded, "Don't touch my son. I have given him to Jesus. Jesus will take care of him."



The first members of the Church of God were eager to talk about Jesus to anyone who showed the least bit of interest. There was no selfishness, dishonesty, pride or prejudice left in their hearts after the Holy Spirit came in. They even shared their food. It seems they ate in whatever home they happened to be in when a meal was served. These people were devout religious people. They went often into the Jewish temple although they knew that some of the temple leaders hated Jesus. Besides being a good place to pray, it gave the disciples a chance to meet many good people who also came there to worship God. They were not the least bit ashamed but spoke often to others about Jesus.

One day as two members of this newly formed Church of God were going into the temple, a beggar asked them for money. Neither had money, but they did not feel sorry for themselves. They knew they had something better than all the money in the world. "Silver and gold have I none," said Peter, "but such as I have, give I to thee. In the name of Jesus ... rise up and walk." The man leaped up and began praising God. Yes, Peter shared something far better than money.

Have you often wished for money to give or to buy something for someone who was in need? That is a good desire, but there are things more valuable than money that can be given to others. The most valuable thing that anyone can have is a personal relationship with Jesus. Of course you cannot give it away, but you can share some of your experiences with others, and perhaps they will want to draw nearer to God, also.

I read about a boy who shared a tract with a man. The man was ready to kill himself, but after reading the tract, he decided not to commit suicide. He prayed to God for help and the Lord helped him out. Later he got saved and shared how the tract had helped save him from going to hell.

There are many other things you can share with others. Your time is valuable and can be shared. It is selfish to use all our time for the things we like to do. Use some of your time helping others. Listen to someone who needs to talk. People who live alone have a great need for someone to listen to them. It isn't hard work. It just takes a little time and patience. But to do this, you will need unselfish hearts like those in the early Church of God.

Our strength is another thing that we can share. Some people are weak, too weak to lift things that don't seem heavy at all. Some can hardly carry out the trash. Some may just be very tired, and lending a helping hand for just a short while is a great help to them.

Your eyes are also valuable and can be shared. You may read to someone who cannot see well or is unable to read. You may also help some elderly person find something that is lost. There are many ways we can share with others the eyes which God gave us.

We may also share our parents with others who need them. Or maybe it is a brother, sister, or friend which you need to share. There are many, many ways and things which even the very poorest person can share with others. Let us be like the Apostles Peter and John. Even though we do not have money, let us share with others that treasure of knowing Jesus Christ.

Sharing was an everyday way of living with those in the early church. It is still an everyday way of living for those in the Church of God. The members in this church are not spotted with selfishness, pride, dishonesty or prejudice. Their garments of salvation are pure white. This is the righteousness of the saints.

in constant fear of being caught and jailed. Sometimes he wore women's clothing to protect himself. Now some of these men here were looking for an excuse to get at him.

At five o'clock many field workers came in the drizzling rain to see what was going on. The growing crowd was too much for Mr. Kollipara. He began trembling violently. A man offered him a blanket. "Thank you," he said and wrapped the blanket over his body pretending he was cold. But that didn't stop his shivering.

The priests, the Sadducees, and the Pharisees had schemed and worked until they succeeded in having Jesus killed. They had hoped this would put an end to His teachings, and that soon He would have no followers. But since the day of Pentecost, thousands had left the Jewish religion to follow Christ's teachings. How fast the Church was growing! How angry the Jewish priests were! Then God healed the lame man by the gate Beautiful. and more people praised Jesus. Trying desperately to stop the spread of Christianity, they threw Peter and John into an inner prison.

After spending a night in jail, Peter and John were brought before a great crowd of temple leaders. It was during the feast of Pentecost. The Jews were obligated to attend this feast, so priests and Jewish leaders from many towns and nations were in Jerusalem. The large group gathered to accuse and threaten Peter and John, hoping it would put a stop to the spread of this new church.

Before Peter was filled with the Holy Spirit, he had been ashamed to admit that he was a follower of Jesus. Now he spoke boldly of Jesus to men who could have him and John punished severely. He would not deny his Lord as he had done before. When Annas, the high priest, asked, "By what name, have ye done this?" Peter boldly answered, "Be it known unto you, and all

God has His own way of keeping His Church clean. There was great faith in the early Church of God, and many miracles were happening. Also, the new Christians were so excited to be a part of God's church that they felt earthly properties were not very important. Some sold their houses and land and gave the money to the Apostles so bread could be bought for the poor Christians. (This money was not used to feed lazy persons, or drunkards, for it was the Jewish law that such people should not eat.) Many, many people wanted to be a part of this new exciting church.

Joses, a religious leader who had become a member of the Church of God, sold some land and gave it to the church. Then Ananias and Sapphira sold one of their properties. However, they decided to keep some of the money for themselves and take only part of it to the Apostles. To keep part of the money for themselves would have been okay, if they had not pretended they were giving all the money received from the sale of the land. By doing this they were lying to both God and man.

Some people find it easy to lie to God. One reason for this is that promises made to God are many times a secret between only the person and God. No human knows the promise, so no human would know if the promise is being kept. There is no embarrassment or humiliation before men if the promise

is broken. Or at least that is what people think. In the lesson today, the secret was revealed by the Holy Spirit to everyone, and Ananias and Sapphire were condemned before God and man and God took their lives.

Another reason it is easy for some people to be dishonest to God is that they believe that God's love makes Him an easy pushover—just treat Him any way, break your promise, transgress His laws, or whatever and He will love as if you had treated Him correctly. This idea about God is a very dangerous one. God is love. He loves everyone, but He also knows every secret of each heart. Because of God's love for evervone, sometimes He allows bad to fall upon those who do evil. This was the case with Ananias and Sapphira. It may seem that the punishment was too severe, but we do not know all the other evil things that they may have been doing or would have done, should they had gotten by with this evil. By letting these two hypocrites meet their end publicly, a fear fell on all who heard about it. People were then afraid of being dishonest and pretending to do something they really did not do. or pretending to be something they really were not. They learned that God is not an easy pushover.

Ananias and Sapphira's death did not stop growth in the Church of God. It did stop hypocrisy and dishonesty within the congregation. A pure congregation has more positive affects on sinners. God's desire is that all men come to repentance. Therefore He desires a clean congregation, and He has unusual ways of cleaning and keeping it clean.


"Why—you —cry?" he asked. "I'm not dead."

In the beginning years of the Church of God, it had a social system that distributed food to the poor and cared for the sick. Their social system was without discrimination of race, sexes, economic status or any other thing. There were seven men appointed over this business. These men were honest men, full of the Holy Ghost and wisdom. Nothing was taken by force from the rich and given to the poor. No taxes were involved. Neither was tithing used to operate their social system.

The people were so committed to God that those who had possessions, said, "These are not mine, they belong to God." So they gladly sold the possessions and the money was given to the leaders of the Church with no restriction on how the money was to be used. The unity was so great, that the whole church was of one accord, one soul, and one heart. They did not doubt the moneys would be used properly. Food was bought with much of this money and given to the poor which were among the thousands of believers in Jerusalem.

The sick were not taken to hospitals or health care centers. The sick were brought to the Apostles in faith that healing would end the sickness.

Was this social system without problems? No. There were racial problems; the Grecians murmuring against the Hebrews. But the problem was quickly taken care of and many more people were added to the Church.

Faith and love caused the social system of the early Church of God to

work well. There was great faith among the members, faith in God and one another. There was great love among its members, love for God and love for other people. When these two ingredients are strongly active in the Church today the same social system will work.

There was no doubt in the people's minds when they brought their sick to the Apostle, that the sick would be healed. We have the same promise of healing and are commanded to call the elders, but how much faith do we have that healing will follow?

There was no doubt in the believer's minds that when they gave their money away, Jesus would supply their needs. Yes, faith and love will make the Apostles' social system work for us today.

Stephen was the first martyr of the Church of God. He was willing to die for the TRUTH. Let us each ask ourselves, "Am I willing to die for the Truth? All of us, even very young children, need to take courage and be willing to suffer for truth; for the people of God have always been persecuted by the world. Stephen asked the men in the council, "Which of the prophets have not your fathers persecuted?" All men, women and children who have chosen to go to heaven have suffered as the prophets suffered. People living today who have the same goal, will also suffer.

The Church of God, or God's Kingdom, is founded on good principles. The kingdom of this world is founded on evil principles. These two kingdoms have always been enemies to each other, and they will be as long as the world stands. At that time the kingdom of the world, satan's kingdom, will be destroyed. God's kingdom will be tenderly carried away into heaven.

Stephen chose to suffer for the Church of God. He could have kept silent or told the council that they were wonderful, godly men. Stephen, however, did not liken them to the holy Jewish fathers. He said they were like the wicked Jewish fathers who had stoned and killed the prophets which God had sent unto them.

When Stephen finished talking, his faced looked like an angel's, but hostility and anger showed on the face of his persecutors. They gritted their teeth like animals baring their fangs. Oh, how they wanted to kill him that very moment! But they were

respected as holy men, so they must act properly. Finishing the trial and pronouncing the death sentence in a respectable manner was the correct thing to do. So they clenched their fists in an attempt to subdue the anger that boiled within. Then Stephen said, "I see the heavens open, and Jesus standing on the right hand of God." They exploded!! All dignity flew out the window. The men slapped their hands over their ears and cried out, "Say no more!" Hauling him outside the city, they proceeded to stone him without a legal verdict of Stephen's guilt.

Those who witnessed against Stephen were required by Jewish law to throw the first stones. Tearing off their outer garments, they laid them for safekeeping at the feet of a young man named Saul. Grabbing up the nearest, largest stones, they hurled them in the fury of all their penned up hatred. Others satisfied their murderous anger in the same manner.

Acts 8:5-7, 9-10, 12-15, 17-22, 24-25

- 5 Then Philip went down to the city of Samaria, and preached Christ unto them.
- **6** And the people with one accord gave heed unto those things which Philip spake, hearing and seeing the miracles which he did.
- 7 For unclean spirits, crying with loud voice, came out of many that were possessed with them: and many taken with palsies, and that were lame, were healed.
- **9** But there was a certain man, called Simon, which beforetime in the same city used sorcery, and bewitched the people of Samaria,...

The Church of God crossed over centuries of prejudice to minister to the people in Samaria. The Jews and the Samaritans had been enemies for many, many years. The Jews would have no business or religious dealings with the Samaritans. They would not eat at the same table, nor use the same cooking dishes even after the dishes were washed. They would not borrow, nor drink water from the same well. The most upmerciful attitude of the Jews was about religion. They wanted the Samaritans to have no relationship with God. Their base desire was that God would completely destroy the Samaritans.

The Samaritans also hated the Jews. There was a time that Jesus and his disciples were passing through Samaria and they were not allowed to stay overnight in any village. This is recorded in Luke 9:51-56.

Jesus ignored all this prejudice when he drank water from their public well, out of a Samaritan woman's jug.

Although the new Church was mostly Jews, their attitude was like that of Jesus. They wanted the Samaritans to have a part in Christ's saving plan. Philip was the first to go and stay with these people to tell them about Christ. He had compassion on the sick, the lame, and those possessed with devils, and through God's power delivered them.

For many years the Samaritans

had believed in Simon, for he had bewitched them using witchcraft. After they felt God's love demonstrated through Philip, and heard him preach the truth, they believed in Jesus and were baptized. Simon was also baptized and followed Philip around.

When the Apostles heard about God working in Samaria, they sent Peter and John to help Philip. When the brethren came, they found out that none of the Samaritans had received the Holy Spirit so they laid hands on them and prayed. The Holy Spirit fell on them as it had fallen on those in Jerusalem, except none spoke in tongues. (Probably because all spoke the same language, so their was no need for different languages.)

Simon was amazed at what he saw! "Take this money, and give me that power," he said.

"You are wrong," Peter told Simon. "You need to repent and pray God to forgive you of pride and wanting glory for yourself."

Do you think God would have blessed the work in Samaria if Philip had been proud and wanting glory for himself? No. Do you think the Church would have been started in Samaria if Philip had held on to the Jewish intolerance toward the Samaritans? No. Yet there are many believers who are proud and intolerant. Others have prejudice against certain kinds or races of people, and they wonder why there are so few miracles in the Church. They need to repent of wrong thinking and actions.

The Church of God reaches its hands of fellowship to every blood washed one even though centuries of traditions may try to separate them.

Then they asked Jaya if she wanted to go. "I am ready to go wherever the people want to hear about Jesus," she answered.

The next day the brethren loaded an ox cart with their luggage and put nine-year-old Jaya on the seat. As people at the convention watched them loading up, more and more Christians joined the group. When the ox drawn cart finally left Mudenepalli and started on the dusty road to Avyirlagads, forty people were walking behind it singing songs of praise to God.

When they arrived in Avyirlagads where Mr. Yesudas lived, he led them to a place that looked more like a stable than a home. The house had only posts and a thatch roof. Many brethren burst into tears when they saw the pitiful condition, and realized how much the family was sacrificing to have a gospel meeting. Those who had criticized felt very ashamed. "How sad, how sad," they said. Others were tormented with fear of what they might suffer in this place.

Mr. Yesudas politely introduced the forty brethren to his wife and six boys. All of the boys were under fourteen years of age. "These four boys," he said pointing to the four older ones, "have worked as slaves for one year so we could have this meeting."

Working as a slave is terrible. Everyday the slave must do whatever the master wants. After the master's family has eaten until they are full, he gets only the food left over. One slave must baby sit the family cow or cows. This slave sleeps with the cows, cleans up their droppings, gives them a bath everyday, sees that they have plenty of food, and that they are kept safe from danger. Often the slaves work long hours in the hot sun. and usually have very little to eat.

"This family has given all for Jesus," said one brother. "God will surely give a revival."

Many people gathered for the first day of the meeting. After everyone had finished eating, all the food was gone. "What shall we do for tomorrow?" the brethren were asking each other.

The next morning a rich neighbor sent plenty of food for breakfast. The servant who delivered the food, handed Mr. Yesudas a note. It read:

"Yesterday as I was taking a walk, I heard the gospel message. I want to help so I'm sending this food."

At lunch time the lady sent another cart full of food. The meeting which had been planned for three days continued five days and the rich woman supplied three meals every day for all the people who attended.

The preceding twelve lessons have been about the Church of God. From these lessons we have learned that the Church of God is the body of Christ. This body is made up of people who have been saved by the blood of Jesus. These saved people are scattered throughout every country of the world. They are humble men, women and children shining forth God's light into the world by the clean, holy way they live. Sometimes they are able to work together as the Church at Jerusalem did. Sometimes they witness for Jesus in a personal way as Philip is doing in our lesson today.

How did all these people become Christians? They became Christians because someone told them about Jesus, just as Philip told the Ethiopian man. If a Christian will do as Jesus would do, God can use him just as he did Philip. The man whom Philip told about Christ had come many miles to Jerusalem to worship God. He was stirred to please God, but he did not know how to be saved. As he returned home he was studying his Bible, but he could not understand what he was reading. Then God told Philip to go and teach the man.

Do you wonder what thoughts went through Philip's mind? What if Philip had taken a long hard look at the plush chariot and said to himself, "This man has everything; fame, riches, and honor. He will not want to become a part of the humble Church of God. Why should I speak to him? He won't listen to me." Philip did not listen to any discouraging thoughts.

What if Philip had not obeyed God? The government official might have gone back to Ethiopia and not gotten saved. He may never have come in contact with another person who knew about Jesus. The Holy Spirit is still leading members of the Church of God to witness to government officials. People in government positions have a great need for knowing the saving power of Jesus. It will aid them greatly in making wise decisions.

Each of us must be careful to do the small unnoticed tasks that God lets come to us. Jesus may want us to witness to a smaller brother or sister, maybe a friend, or neighbor. He may want us to be friends to a person who has no friend. By doing this we show Jesus through our actions. Sometimes the tasks which seem so unimportant are the avenues that lead a person to know Jesus as their Saviour.

I read about a boy who learned to play the guitar very well. He studied hard and practiced long hours until he mastered the guitar. Finally he got a chance to perform. The performance was a great success! Instantly, he became famous. Calls came from all over our country and foreign countries. Soon he was also rich!

He thought happiness came with riches and fame, but he was disappointed. Year after year he played. The people applauded, but he wasn't happy. He was an outdoors man. Seeking happiness, he saved all the money he would need for the rest of his life. Then he bought a large ranch in the mountains. Now he could hunt, fish and be happy in the great outdoors. However, he found that he didn't find happiness doing only the things he liked best.

One day a neighbor rancher gave him a New Testament. The New Testament changed his life! Now he is happy and desires to sing and play only gospel songs. It was such a small task to give a New Testament. But what if the neighbor had not shared with him?

Jesus said, "My meat (that which strengthens Me) is to do the will of Him that sent Me." The Church of God is kept alive and growing by those little personal things that help others know about salvation.

"We will see that you have everything you need."


"Please, please, stay just awhile longer and teach us more about Jesus."

We shall now study a series of doctrines taught by the preachers of the Church of God when it was first formed. From the very first sermon on the day of Pentecost, the apostles taught biblical truths. On that day they were trying to convince the people that Jesus is the divine Son of God, the Saviour of all men. To this very day God's ministers are still trying to convince people of this truth. This truth is the foundation of every Christian's experience, so we shall study it in this first lesson.

Before any person can be saved, he must believe that Jesus was not just a wonderful man who went about doing good. He or she must confess that Jesus is Creator and Ruler of everything, that He is God as well as His Father.

How Jesus can be God and His Father also be God is a mystery which only a saved person can understand. Sometimes a person must blindly trust in Jesus. Then after he has experienced the love of God in his heart, he will truly believe that Jesus is divine.

Is there Bible evidence that Jesus is Lord? Yes, there are very many scriptures which call Jesus Lord or Saviour. Many of the Old Testament prophets spoke of Jesus as their redeemer and they lived and died before His birth. Before Jesus' conception, the angel said He would not have an earthly father. The spirit of the Highest overshadowed Mary, and her child was the Son of God. The angels sang praises at Jesus birth, saying, "...Unto you is born this day...a Sav-

iour, which is Christ the Lord." The people who knew Jesus proclaimed Him to be the Son of God. Even the evil spirits called Him God's Son. (If evil spirits can identify who Jesus is, intelligent people should also be able to do so.) Those unbelievers watching at the cross felt the tremor of the earthquake and cried out, "Truly this was the Son of God." The apostle Paul was saved after Jesus died, but he, too, said that Jesus was the Son of God. The apostle John tells us that Jesus was the Creator, that all things were made by Him and that He lived in the world that He created. The apostles taught that Jesus is the Lord, the Saviour of the world, and the scriptures prove it. But none of this knowledge will help us unless He is the Lord of our personal lives. That is what the apostles taught from the beginning of this gospel.

God and Jesus are one, making them closer than any parent and child. Yet God willingly sacrificed this beloved Son for His enemies.

Without saying a word, Pauljerked the cigarettes out of his pocket and crushed them. "I need a personal experience with Jesus," he admitted.


The meeting started right then, when Jaya prayed for Paul until he was saved. Now Paul sang the gospel from his heart.

Sad news was awaiting Jaya when she returned from another preaching trip. Vani had gotten married. She was the shepherd girl who had been so nice to Jaya when she was alone. A few weeks after their wedding, her husband had died!

Being a widow was about the worst thing that could happen to an Indian girl. In the olden days many devoted wives burned to death with the body of her husband as it was being burned. Today, the country's laws will not permit such actions. But once in a while a widow will do it. She chooses death. rather than the cruel abuse often received from in-laws. The custom is that a widow stay with her husband's family until death. Some families so strongly resent having to support their son's widow, that many have caused "accidental death" to get rid of her. Jaya hoped nothing like that would happen to dear Vani.

Most Indians believe God causes a husband to die because He is displeased with the wife. The widow's own family, as well as the family of her husband, treat her with scorn. Some have a special ceremony in which she is covered with a cloth, meaning that no one wants to see her face. Also a

widow must wear only dull clothing. Jaya knew Vani loved brilliant colors, and bright flower prints.

Jaya had seen widows suffering. How she hated to think that kind, loving Vani, only twelve years old, would now be so rejected. Jaya rushed away to her place of prayer. As she worked her way among the thorn bushes, a thorn tore into her arm. "Ouch, you ugly thorn. Don"tyou stick me," she cried. Then she thought of a different thorn that was piercing Vani's heart. People are a unique creation of God. They are different from all the animals and other things that God created. They were created in the image of God. For this reason people are able to communicate with and be controlled by spirits. People can choose to communicate with evil spirits or with God's spirit.

Animals do as God planned. They cannot communicate with spirits. If an animal could communicate with spirits, an evil spirit might influence one of them to sexually abuse their young as humans sometimes do. An evil spirit might convince a lion to create evil recreation for the other lions. Animals do not have freedom to do their own thing. They do what God has designed for them. They are content to do that.

Being able to communicate with God's spirit made Adam able to name and subdue all the animals and tend the big earth garden. If he had been only a body, like an animal, this task would have been impossible. Adam was uniquely different from the animals.

Being in God's image also made people free, free to make their own choices and do their own thing—free to obey God's one commandment to not take of the knowledge of good and evil, free to obey this command. The first man chose to communicate with Satan who influenced him to disobey and eat of the fruit.

God also created people with the ability to live forever as long as they

ate of the tree of life. But having freedom to choose and choosing to eat of the knowledge of good and evil changed things. ("...By one man sin entered into the world, and <u>death</u> by sin; and so <u>death passed upon all men</u>, for that all have sinned." Romans 5:12.) Animals were not given the privilege to eat of the tree of life and live forever.

The water, plants, fish, animals, the whole solar system and everything in it were created to do God's will by nature. They have no choice. People are the unique creation of God that can choose to do what God designed for them to do, or they can choose to not do it.

Romans 5:1-2, 6-12, 17-21

- 1 Therefore being justified by faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ:
- 2 By whom also we have access by faith into this grace wherein we stand, and rejoice in hope of the glory of God.
- **6** For when we were yet without strength, in due time Christ died for the ungodly.

- 18 Therefore as by the offence of one judgment came upon all men to condemnation; even so by the rightcousness of one the free gift came upon all men unto justification of life.

- 19 For as by one man's disobedience many were made sinners, so by the obedience of one shall many be made righteous.
- 20 Moreover the law entered, that the offence might abound. But where sin abounded, grace did much more abound.
- 21 That as sin hath reigned unto death, even so might grace reign through righteousness unto eternal life by Jesus Christ our Lord.

Hebrews 7:22-28

- 22 By so much was Jesus made a surety of a better testament.
- 23 And they truly were many priests, because they were not suffered to continue by reason of death:

Some people believe that man was created in the image of God so he is basically good; and if he has the proper environment to train him to think correctly, he will be a good person. Some believe the image of God is like a little God within each person. Man's struggle is to bring this little God to the surface so it can make the person righteous.

The apostles taught a doctrine quite different from this. They taught that sin entered into the world when Adam disobeyed and acquired the knowledge of good and evil. That sin was passed on to every person. People then are basically sinful and each has sinned, The apostle Paul said when people sin, they then come under death. (Romans 5:12.)

In order to be redeemed from this death a sacrifice must be made. In years gone by, priests sacrificed animals, and this was acceptable to God. But today each person must accept the sacrifice of God's holy Son, Jesus. He gave himself a sacrifice in death that sinful people could be redeemed back to God. Loving God and having faith in His Son Jesus is the simple equation to justification before God.

Millions of people, who had no Bibles, felt their evil actions angered God so they invented different ways of appeasing this supposed wrath. The most common way was through sacrificing animals, their children, beautiful virgins, and endless other things. People today are much like men of the past ages. Often they try to gain God's favor through sacrifice rather than by believing, loving and obeying Him. Some give thousands of dollars, others sacrifice a normal life to live a solitary life of chanting prayers; etc. Some have given everything and lived as beggers. But God is not wanting people to sacrifice for their sins. He says, "Obedience is better than sacrifice."

The apostles taught that God is love and that He has supplied His own sacrifice. Man's only duty to be justified before God is to love Him and believe in His plan. Loving God consists of obeying Him. Jesus said, "If ye love me keep my commandments." The apostle John said, "This is the love of God, that we keep his commandments: and his commandments are not grievous."

"Therefore being justified by faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ." Trying to make ourselves good will not bring peace with God. Man is not basically good within himself. Only through justification, by faith in Jesus, can a man be good in God's eyes.

"Shall I go pray for the baby?" Jaya asked Jesus.


"Go." He answered.

New Words: 1. The old man is a person's sinful habits. 2. A mortal body is a fleshly body. 3. Dominion is control.

Romans 6:2-23

- 2 How shall we, that are dead to sin, live any longer therein?
- 3 Know ye not, that so many of us as were baptized into Jesus Christ were baptized into his death?
- 4 Therefore we are buried with him by baptism into death: that like as Christ was raised up from the dead by the glory of the Father, even so we also should walk in newness of life.
- **5** For if we have been planted together in the likeness of his death, we shall be also in the likeness of his resurrection:
- 6 Knowing this, that our old man is crucified with him, that the body of sin might be destroyed, that henceforth we should not serve sin.
 - 7 For he that is dead is freed from sin.
- 8 Now if we be dead with Christ, we believe that we shall also live with him:
- **9** Knowing that Christ being raised from the dead dieth no more; death hath no more dominion over him.
- 10 For in that he died, he died unto sin once: but in that he liveth, he liveth unto God.
- 11 Likewise reckon ye also yourselves to be dead indeed unto sin, but alive unto God through Jesus Christ our Lord.
- 12 Let not sin therefore reign in your mortal body, that ye should obey it in the lusts thereof.
- 13 Neither yield ye your members as instruments of unrighteousness unto sin: but yield yourselves unto God, as those that are alive from the dead, and

your members as instruments of righteousness unto God.

- 14 For sin shall not have dominion over you: for ye are not under the law, but under grace.
- 15 What then? shall we sin, because we are not under the law, but under grace? God forbid.
- 16 Know ye not, that to whom ye yield yourselves servants to obey, his servants ye are to whom ye obey; whether of sin unto death, or of obedience unto righteousness?
- 17 But God be thanked, that ye were the servants of sin, but ye have obeyed from the heart that form of doctrine which was delivered you.
- 18 Being then made free from sin, ye became the servants of righteousness.
- 19 I speak after the manner of men because of the infirmity of your flesh: for as ye have yielded your members servants to uncleanness and to iniquity unto iniquity; even so now yield your members servants to righteousness unto holiness.
- 20 For when ye were the servants of sin, ye were free from righteousness.
- 21 What fruit had ye then in those things whereof ye are now ashamed? for the end of those things is death.
- 22 But now being made free from sin, and become servants to God, ye have your fruit unto holiness, and the end everlasting life.
- 23 For the wages of sin is death; but the gift of God is eternal life through Jesus Christ our Lord.

The Message: A Christian must crucify sinful thoughts and actions and live holy in this world.

The apostles taught the believers that each Christian was a changed person. He or she would now think differently. He would not like the same things, nor do the sins he had done before becoming a Christian.

The early Christians changed so much that the apostle Paul called it dying to sin. He said just as Jesus was crucified and died, so every Christian must crucify sinful habits and die to his old ways.

Without oxygen, a person dies. Breathing brings this needed oxygen into our body. A dead person does not breathe. If a Christian stops drawing sinful thoughts into his or her mind, sinful habits will die for they cannot live without evil thoughts. If an evil thought should come to mind, the Christian should resist such thoughts, and not allow the thoughts to stay.

A dead person does not eat. Eating is putting fuel into the body. Christians quit looking at, listening to, or reading anything that will fuel his desires to sin. Sin cannot live without this fuel.

Drinking and moving are impossible for a dead man. Just so a Christian stops drinking of the lustful pleasures of life. He stops going to ungodly entertainments. All his movements are to serve his wonderful new Master.

The apostles taught that a person is a servant to whom he obeys. There are two moral kingdoms, one of evil, one of good. Each of these

kingdoms has an invisible ruler. If a person continues sinning he is obeying the ruler of evil. If he does good, he is obeying the Ruler of good. Which ruler should a Christian obey?

Sin is like a possessive monster. If we yield to sinful thoughts or desires, the monster of sin will soon reign over us. It will have so much power over us that we will find ourselves sinning even when we wish to do good. The apostle Paul said, "Let not sin reign in your body,...for sin shall not have dominion over you." We are servant to whomever we obey. Each ruler pays wages to those he rules. "The wages of sin is death, but the gift of God is eternal life."

The apostles taught that a Christian is dead to sin. He is buried to sin in baptism. Sin has no power over him. Now he is raised up in a new life; a life free from the binding power of sin.

If you find yourself unable to overcome sin in your life, call on Jesus. He will deliver you from its power. Then you can practice holy living and will be living as the apostle taught that people should live.

Hebrews 10:1, 4, 9-12, 14-19, 22-23 28-29, 31

- 1 The law...can never...make the comers thereunto perfect.
- 4 For it is not possible that the blood of bulls and of goats should take away sins.
- **9** Then said he,...He taketh away the first, that he may establish the second.
- 10 By the which...we are sanctified through the offering of the body of Jesus Christ once for all.
- 11 And every priest standeth daily ministering and offering often times the same sacrifices, which can never take away sins:
- 12 But this man, [Jesus] after he had offered one sacrifice for sins for ever, sat down on the right hand of God:
- 14 For by one offering he hath perfected for ever them that are sanctified.
- 15 Whereof the Holy Ghost also is a witness to us: for...
- 16 This is the covenant that I will make with them...,saith the Lord, I will put my laws into their hearts, and in their minds will I write them;
- 17 And their sins and iniquities will I remember no more.
- 18 Now where remission of these is, there is no more offering for sin.
- 19 Having therefore, brethren, boldness to enter into the holiest by the blood of Jesus.
- **22** Let us draw near with a true heart in full assurance of faith,...
- 23 Let us hold fast the profession of our faith without wavering; (for he is

faithful that promised;)

- 28 He that despised Moses' law died without mercy under two or three witnesses:
- 29 Of how much sorer punishment, suppose ye, shall he be thought worthy, who hath trodden under foot the Son of God, and hath counted the blood of the covenant, wherewith he was sanctified, an unholy thing, and hath done despite unto the Spirit of grace?
- **31** It is a fearful thing to fall into the hands of the living God.

I Corinthians 6:9-11

- 9 Knowye not that the unrighteous shall not inherit the kingdom of God? Be not deceived: neither fornicators, nor idolaters, nor adulterers, nor effeminate, nor abusers of themselves with mankind.
- 10 Nor thieves, nor covetous, nor drunkards, nor revilers, nor extortioners, shall inherit the kingdom of God.
- 11 And such were some of you: but ye are washed, but ye are sanctified, but ye are justified in the name of the Lord Jesus, and by the Spirit of our God.

Verse to Memorize

And the very God of peace sanctify you wholly; and I pray God your whole spirit and soul and body be preserved blameless....

I Thessalonians 5:23.



Before Jesus died, God's people sacrificed animals for the remission of their sins. God accepted these offerings because they were an act of obedience and He forgave their sins. Each year the person had to sacrifice again for his sins for there was no power in the blood of the bulls, or goats, or sheep, to keep man from sinning again.

Jesus, however, sacrificed His sinless body one time and it covered the sins of all people, for all ages. Now people do not have to live under sin's bondage and come again and again to get forgiveness. When a person asks forgiveness, and believes Jesus' death is the sacrifice for his personal sins, God removes all his sins.

The sanctifying power puts God's laws in a Christian's heart so he has power to resist new temptations to sin. Before Jesus' death, a person could have God's laws in his mind if he studied hard and memorized. Some did, and they tried hard to obey the laws of God, yet the Bible says, that within a year they had failed, and needed to make another sacrifice for other sins. A sanctified person, with God's laws in both his mind and his heart, does not have to fall into sin.

The apostles taught that to be sanctified, a person who has been cleansed from past sins must present himself to God for service. The dishes, candle holders and others vessels in the temple were sanctified vessels because they were to be used only

for the glory of God. So when a sinless person is willing to give himself to God to be used in whatever way God chooses, he can then be sanctified. The Holy Spirit comes into this human vessel and purges out inherited sin and places God's law in the heart. A person with God's law in his heart has power to overcome every temptation.

If a Christian humbly relies on the power of the Holy Spirit he will have no need to ask forgiveness for his sins at the end of each day. He can thank God for keeping him victorious over sin that day. God will sanctify and keep a Christian from sinning in their thoughts, emotions or body. Living this way is not automatic. It takes a lot of spiritual fighting, resisting evil thoughts, doubts, depression, etc., and holding fast the profession of our faith.

The believers in those first Churches of God rejoiced that they had been delivered from the bondage of sin and did not need to return each day or each year to offer a sacrifice for new sins.

I John 1:5-10

- **5** This then is the message which we have heard of him, and declare unto you, that God is light, and in him is no darkness at all.
- 6 If we say that we have fellowship with him, and walk in darkness, we lie, and do not the truth:
- 7 But if we walk in the light, as he is in the light, we have fellowship one with another, and the blood of Jesus Christ his Son cleanseth us from all sin.
- 8 If we say that we have no sin, we deceive ourselves, and the truth is not in us.
- 9 If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just to forgive us our sins, and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness.
- 10 If we say that we have not sinned, we make him a liar, and his word is not in us.

I John 3:1-10

- 1 Behold, what manner of love the Father hath bestowed upon us, that we should be called the sons of God: therefore the world knoweth us not, because it knew him not.
- 2 Beloved, now are we the sons of God, and it doth not yet appear what we shall be: but we know that, when he shall appear, we shall be like him; for we shall see him as he is.
- 3 And every man that hath this hope in him purifieth himself, even as he is pure.

One time the apostle Paul visited the city of Athens and saw that the city was worshiping a god they had named, "The Unknown God." "There was a time when God winked at such ignorance." Paul told them. "But now since Jesus made a way for people to live without sin, God is commanding all men to repent." God's Word says, "He that committeth sin is of the devil, for the devil sinneth from the beginning. For this purpose Jesus was sent into the world to destroy the works of the devil." Jesus was a person with the same emotions, mind and body as we have. He was tempted on all points but able to live without sinning. He then gave His sinless body as a sacrifice to break the bondage of sin for those who believe in Him. Now God expects all Christians to use His power to live without sin. If they do not, then they should not call themselves Christians, for the apostle John said, "Those who sin are not in Christ neither have they seen or known Him."


Did any of Jesus' disciples say they were sinners saved by grace? We often hear Christians say they sin almost every day. Some preachers proudly broadcast, "I am a sinner saved by grace." Now we shall have a homework assignment. Find in the New Testament where any of the apostles or disciples said they were sinners after they became followers of Christ. (Be careful with

Romans, chapter seven. To understand it read chapters, six and eight.) The apostle John said, "Whoever is born of God doth not commit sin, for God's seed is in him."

Then if a person practices sin, he is not a born again Christian. Those who sin daily do not have God's seed in their heart, for God is righteous and His seed would produce righteous fruit in that person. "Whosoever doeth not righteousness is not of God," is what John said. It is clearly taught in the Bible that Christians must not sin.

We must understand that sinning is transgressing God's law. It is not just being unthoughtful or unkind when tired. You may think it is impossible to know and obey all of Gods laws, but there are two laws that are over all the others. These laws are "Love God with all your heart and love your neighbor as yourself." If these are obeyed all others will be obeyed. So then, any person who trusts God's power can live without sinning, as God expects Christians to do.

"Yes, I will be happy to stay with you," Jaya said, as she silently praised God.

When they arrived in Madras a group of Christians were planning a revival and praying for God to send a speaker. They asked Jaya to share her experiences with them. For weeks Jaya met daily with them to have prayer meeting for the revival. In the evening she preached. God sent a real revival in the church. When that revival was finished, they moved into a public place and continued the re-

vival. Thousands came to hear the gospel. Some workers said that one night around 2,000 people came to the altar for prayer.

One of them was a bank robber. He had been caught and punished severely many times. One time he was punished by putting straight pins under his fingernails. Even that punishment did not break him. He was so bound by Satan, that he continued stealing. God delivered this man at that meeting. He began preaching while Jaya was still in Madras.

A Hindu woman who had much jewelry was also saved in that meeting. She sold her jewelry and built a church. There the converted bank robber preached the gospel.

Another listener of this open-air revival was Paul Gupta, director of the Hindustan Bible Institute. He was a converted Hindu. At that time he did not believe that God used women to preach. But when he heard Jaya, he was convinced that God was at least using her. One day when he and a visiting American missionary were finishing breakfast he said, "Would you like to meet that girl who is preaching at the revival?"

"Yes, why, yes," answered Mr. Bustin. He too believed that women should keep silent in the Church according to I Cor. 14:34.

At the Hindustan Bible Institute Jaya was introduced to Mr. and Mrs. G.T. Bustin. "Is this the couple who will take me to America?" she wondered.

Mr. Bustin said nothing about America. He was interested in hearing how God was working in India. Mrs. Bustin sat at his side writing as Java told them about God healing many, many people. Some were healed of cancers, heart trouble, poisonous bites, boils, devil possession, witch doctor spells and many other troubles. She told of the hundreds of Hindus who had become Christians after seeing these miracles, of the Catholic priest who had gotten saved and other professed Christians who were born again. Then she told of her Communist father who had been so bound by pride that he abused her. Now he was winning his friends to Jesus.

Mr. Giri listened carefully as Jaya spoke in Telugu. Then he would signal her to stop, and he would tell the same story in English to the Bustin's.

"I think these experiences should be written and published so other young people can know how God is working," Mr. Bustin said. "Do you mind if I print a book?"

"I want God to be glorified," Jaya

said. "I don't want any glory. I am only a little servant of my great Jesus. Neither do I want anyone making money writing about what only God can do."

"I will do my best to bring glory to God and not you," he promised and I will not make money on the sale of this booklet."

Jaya was getting more and more calls to speak after the big Baptist convention and the outdoor meeting in Madras. Churches from all over the country were writing letters, sending telegrams, calling on the telephone. All that year, and the next, Jaya traveled, not only to villages but to large cities. The Catholic, Lutherans, Baptist, Methodist, and many other denominations invited her. Many tried to persuade her to join them. A Catholic priest said that the pope had sent a special invitation to her.

She ministered to both the rich and the poor. Important politicians, doctors and lawyers, came to her for prayer or counsel. Jaya always said, "I have no wisdom of my own. Remember the time when you were trying to impress a new friend and your sibling had a temper tantrum while standing beside you? Have you ever come home and found your once clean room a total disaster, or your favorite friend's picture torn to bits by small hands? Have you ever been shopping and heard a bratty child screaming at top volume? Did you think some correction was needed? Do you suppose the child would have enjoyed the discipline?

Do you think perhaps some things we do seem pretty bratty to God? Do you suppose God's discipline could correct some of our actions? All of us are God's children. Some are His by creation, some are His by both creation and spiritual birth. God loves all His children. For this reason, He takes time to discipline. Discipline has a way of crushing our bad actions and bringing out our best. The apostle Paul said, "Whom the Lord loveth he chasteneth, and scourgeth every son whom he receiveth."

The Lord knows that our natures are to explore, to experience the unknown, to try the forbidden. This curiosity leads us into things that are not good for us. That is when God steps into our lives and lays down some discipline—maybe an accident, or sickness, or a failed test. Whatever the discipline, it is always connected to suffering. The

suffering seems to make an impression on our mind so that we remember not to act improperly again. Even Christ as powerful and sinless as He was had to suffer to learn obedience. How much more will you and I need to suffer to learn how to think and act as we should. The next time you suffer discipline from God or a parent, remember it is for your good.

Occasionally a parent may discipline because of anger, but most often it is for the child's good. You may not believe it, but many times it would be easier for Mom or Dad to ignore your incorrect action. Parents who truly love their children will take the time needed to discipline correctly.

Let's take the time right now and bow our heads and thank God for the disciplines He has put in our lives. When it is possible, also, thank your parents for their efforts to discipline you. Some may want to just tell their parents, others may feel more comfortable writing a note. If you will do this often, your attitude will change and the disciplines will become less, and less. Try it!




In the Bible prejudice is called "having respect of persons." Prejudice is suspicion, intolerance, or irrational hatred of other races, religions, regions or occupations. It is not based on facts. It is unfair judgment that does not give a person the chance to earn respect. We all know that respect is earned by a person's attitude and conduct. That is why one person is respected more than another. A father supplies for his family and earns their respect. A minister gives wise counsel and earns respect. A friend helps when needed, and is respected for it. Prejudice doesn't allow a person this chance to earn respect.

All people, even strangers, should be respected as a person, a child of God with hidden potentials to be a real saint. Christ loved those unlovable persons and gave His life for them also. God sometimes calls great leaders from among the outcasts. John Newton, who wrote "Amazing Grace." was once a slave trader. George Washington Carver lived in a time when the blacks had very few opportunities, but he found some people who respected him. Some prejudiced persons did not give him a fair chance, although God had chosen him for a special work. The apostles taught that God had no respect of persons, and that people who do have it, are sinning.

All the world seems to know that Christians should love one another. The apostle John said people have heard it from the beginning of their life. It is the very basis of living peaceably in the world and is the bottom line for Christian living.

Jesus told His disciples that men would know they were His followers if they loved one another. If people do not love one another, are they Jesus' disciples? We are studying today what the apostles said about this question.

James said our salvation depends on how we treat others. He told us that the same God who said, "Thou shalt not commit adultery" and "Thou shalt not kill," also said, "Love one another," and if we obey some commandments yet do not obey others, we are guilty as if we disobeyed all the commandments.

The apostle John said that if a brother is needy and we do not have compassion and help him, we do not have God's love in us. It is not possible to be Jesus' disciple and not have God in our heart, for wherever One is, the Other is there also.

Now let us test our love. First, what is love? Love is a deep, tender feeling for God, a person or something. How is your feeling toward God? Do you feel a deep thankfulness for all He has done for you? If you are happy and content, you have a loving, thankful attitude. Do you feel a little resentful because

God has allowed some bitter thing in your life? Feeling sorry for oneself, asking "Why should this happen to me?" comes from resentful feelings toward God.

Don't despair if you discover your attitude needs improvement. God is merciful and will forgive. Ask Him to clean out unloving feelings and replace them with tender, loving ones. Then discipline yourself to think better thoughts and do more caring things for others.

Each person should keep a close check on his attitude toward God, for our attitude will be reflected out on people and show up in how we treat others. Jesus told His disciples that men would know they were Christians by the love they showed to each other.

He that believeth and is baptized shall be saved; he that believeth not shall be damned. Mark 16:16.




John the Baptist began teaching the people that they should repent and be baptized. Repenting is feeling sorry for and asking forgiveness of sins. Baptism is a symbol of dving to sin and doing what is right. After repenting and believing. a person is saved. At that time, his or her spirit is taken from the kingdom of this world and planted in the kingdom of Christ. Baptism is announcing to the world that the person being baptized is now in Christ's kingdom. He or she is now dead to a sinful life. The way of dressing, of walking and what he represents has all changed. His banner is holiness. His music is praises to God and his speech glorifies God.

As Christ was buried and arose again, so the body of a Christian is buried in water to symbolize Christ's death and resurrection. Have you ever thought how hard it might be for some people to have enough water to be buried in baptism? We are blessed with plenty of water here in America. In many areas of the world, however, water is a precious commodity not to be wasteda precious resource not only for personal use but for growing the food their lives depend upon. Using water for baptism can be a sacrifice. Sometimes the same waterhole where people are baptized is where animals drink and water is drawn for domestic use.

At the campmeeting in El Alamo, Mexico, it is very hard to find a place to baptize. We have to load the pick-ups and cars and drive many miles to find a hole where the water is deep enough to cover a person. If the church had a baptistry, water would have to be drawn by hand out of wells to fill it.

One time I watched people baptizing in an oblong stock-watering tank. The preacher knelt on the outside of the tank. The one being baptized knelt inside the tank and was lowered into the water from that position. Praise God for those who love Jesus enough to sacrifice to be baptized.

You may not have to sacrifice as those brethren, but you may lose friends, be ridiculed by family who don't understand, or suffer in some other way when you are baptized. Jesus suffered too, a death on the cross, for your salvation. So we must arm ourselves to suffer death to sin and live for God. —Charlotte
